Principal's Message:

Encouraging Our Children in Having a True Relationship with Christ

An important character trait to inculcate in our children is that of worshipping the Father in spirit and truth. Jesus said in John 4:23-24, "Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in spirit and in truth" (NIV, italics added). Worshiping the

Father in spirit and truth is glorifying the Lord with an open, honest relationship in which our spirit connects with God's Spirit. I'd like to talk about encouraging our children in having this kind of relationship with Christ.

Worship the Father

Hebrews 13:15 says, "Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise—the fruit of lips that confess his name." God calls us to offer a sacrifice of praise unto the Lord. Sometimes we may "feel" like

worshipping the Lord, sometimes not. But it really doesn't matter if we "feel" like it. God calls us out of obedience to praise and worship Him, who is worthy of our adoration. Just like we train our children to obey in other matters, we should train our children in this very worthy obedience of offering a sacrifice of praise unto the Lord.

Psalm 100:4 gives us guidance: "Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise." Giving thanks and praise unto the Lord starts the process of coming into the presence of the Lord. As we encourage our children in learning to give thanks and praise to God out of obedience, they will gradually experience the reality of coming into his presence in this way.

I encourage you to make the time for praise and worship at home with your family. I like to turn on a praise CD and spend time praising the Lord with my children; in a sense, I am training—or practicing—praising the Lord with them. Also, I encourage you in congregational worship to be actively training your children during praise and worship—train them to enter into worshipping the Lord. The Bible calls for many outward forms of praise such as the dance, clapping hands, and lifting hands; these are excellent ways to engage children in praising God. Don't let your children simply sit and doodle or do whatever during these worship times. As parents, we need to involve our children during congregational worship and train them to actively enter into praise and worship.

Knowing, Loving, and Worshiping God the Father in Spirit

Romans 8:15-16 tells us, "For you did not receive a spirit that makes you a slave again to fear, but you received the Spirit of sonship. And by him we cry, 'Abba, Father.' The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children." As children of God, we receive a spirit of sonship—the Holy Spirit connects with our spirit and encourages us.

Of course, this truth also applies to our children who have received Christ as their personal Savior and

Lord. Our children can know, love, and worship Abba Father with their spirit. They can connect to God in spirit. As sheep of the Good Shepherd, they can learn to hear the encouraging voice of their Good Shepherd. And in this way, they know God! As parents we need to encourage our children to spend regular "quiet times" with the Lord for the purpose of knowing God more and becoming more like Christ. As our children learn to communicate with God through prayer—not only speaking but also spending time listening to God—they grow in knowing Him more. They

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Knowing God the Father in Truth

In addition, we need to encourage our children in having an open, honest relationship with the Lord. 1 John 1:5-9 gives us guidance regarding how to walk in this truthful relationship with God: "This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth. But if

we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin. If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." We need to walk this out as well as regularly encourage our children to openly confess their sin to God. This practice, by its very nature, will foster an honest relationship with the Father.

Romans 12:1 says, "Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God—this is your spiritual act of worship." Ultimately, we need to encourage our children that our whole life is an expression of worship unto God. We have been created to praise His glory! As our children learn to worship God with their very lives, they will become closer and closer to Christ. They will have an ever deepening relationship with the Father—in spirit and in truth! I encourage you to ask God for guidance regarding training and fostering this kind of relationship in your children's lives.

Godly Character Trait for May: Overflowing with Thankfulness

Colossians 2:6-7 states, "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness." May the Lord cause us and our children to be rooted and built up in Christ through a lifestyle of overflowing with gratitude toward our Lord and Savior!

That attitude of gratitude starts with giving thanks in worship of our Lord. I am glad to report that we've been having very good chapels with the students being equipped to truly worship the Lord. As shared in this article, we need to challenge our children to have a true relationship with Jesus Christ. As parents, I encourage you to set aside times in your family to put on a praise song and train your children to truly praise and worship the Lord. Teach them to enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise. Exhort them to persevere—not get tired or get distracted—in going all the way into Christ's presence, the place of being changed. At church, train your children to stand up and give glory to Abba Father through praise and worship. In order for our young people to become champions for the Lord, they need to be true worshipers of Him.
