Principal's Message:

Redeeming the Time with our Children

Over the years I have enjoyed taking my children on bike rides. I recall taking the opportunity to go on a bike ride with my youngest son Joshua. With Joshua sitting right behind me, we talked together, laughed together, and enjoyed the invigorating sensation



of the wind blowing on our faces (especially when we rode downhill). In the process, I was sure to shower a lot of love and affirmation on my son. With the end of the school year and the start of summer, we often have more time to spend with our children. In this society, our lives can get so busy that sometimes we can go days or even weeks without enjoying and playing with our children. (I thoroughly enjoyed our recent Family Day in which as parents and children we were able to cheer each other on and enjoy a great day with one another.) Anyway, summertime provides us with some unique opportunities to "redeem the time" with the purpose of developing a close relational bond with our children.

The Psalmist asked the Lord, "Show me, O Lord, my life's end and the number of my days; let me know how fleeting is my life. You have made my days a mere handbreadth; the span of my years is as nothing before you. Each man's life is but a breath" (NIV, Psalm 39:4-5). Indeed, our heart's cry to the Lord should be to teach us to number our days. Although we don't know exactly what the number of our days is, there *is* a number to our days. God knows that number, and every day we have one day fewer on this earth to live for Christ and impact our children through our loving care and training.

Putting it positively, I've heard the saying that "Today is the first day of the rest of your life." No matter how we've spent our time in the past, we can make a difference in our children's lives today while it is called today. Ephesians 5:15-16 exhorts us, "Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil." Each day is a gift from God, and we can choose to make the most of the opportunities that God gives us. With our children, we can choose to use the opportunities that God gives us to build an unbreakable relational bond characterized by open communication. Let me share with you a few ways that we can redeem the time with our children this summer.

Daddy-Daughter Date or Guys Time Out

With my daughter Anna I like to go on a periodic "Daddy-Daughter Date." With my boys, I call it a "Guys Time Out." No matter what you call it, the purpose of this time is to spend some time away doing something that your child wants to do, shower affirmation on him or her, and listen to see what is really going on in your child's heart and life.

Indoor and Outdoor Games

Indoor games around the table can be refreshing times of enjoyment as a family. We laugh together and have the opportunity to affirm each other as the game is played. This kind of activity may seem

trivial, but it is not a "trivial pursuit" in the lives of our children. Our children will remember and cherish these times which build family unity and camaraderie. Whether it's playing an indoor game or an outdoor game of "Hide and Go Seek," games provide an opportunity for families to spend time together doing something fun. Laughing together as part of play is very healthy for your children and your family's esprit de corps. It's fun to be a family together!

Family Praise and Worship

I encourage you to praise the Lord together as a family. This

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should also be a very fun experience. Turn on a catchy praise song, one in which the words focus your children's hearts and minds on the Lord, and praise the Lord together as a family. This activity is a great way to train our children in the things of the Lord. What better thing to do as a family than to actively praise him—singing and dancing around the living room as unto the Lord!

Family Trips

Invariably we go on some kind of family trip during the summer, whether it's to the beach or for a week away. During the ride to and fro, our children often start asking, "Are we almost there yet?" Well, we can make the most of that time in the vehicle by playing a game. Growing up, we enjoyed playing a game in which we would try to see how many license plates from different states we saw. Or you can play a game in which you accumulate points for calling out a horse (100 points), a tractor (50 points), a cow (25 points), or a motorcycle (15 points). Depending on the age of your children, you could play the parents versus the children (while keeping your eyes on the road, of course). Invigorating discussions as a family can also take place on trips (as opposed to your children simply being into themselves with their Minecraft).

Reading and Discussing Character-Building Stories

I've said it before, but I'm a firm believer in the power of reading strong stories which illuminate Biblical values. Jesus used many fiction stories (parables) in his ministry that people could identify with. I encourage you to take the time to read a short story with your children. Get books that are based on Christian character as opposed to simply *The Cat in the Hat*-type books. This is an excellent way to spend some time together. As you read and discuss the values expressed in the story, you are planting godly seed in your children.

Family Devotions

I encourage you to take the time to open up the Bible with your children from time to time. Read a passage that has spoken to you lately and discuss what it means as a family. Ask each child, "How does this apply to you? What does this teach you?" Let God's Word leave an impression on your children.

Don't Miss Out on Normal Summer Activities with Your Children

Whether it's swimming, going to the playground, enjoying the fireworks on Independence Day, or simply going on a leisurely walk, take the time to do these things with your children. Avoid the temptation to simply "pass" on some of these times. Do every-day things with your children. The common denominator in all of these summer activities is that they give us the opportunity to **build relationship with our children**. Look for opportunities to communicate heart to heart through both listening and sharing with your children—and always encourage them. Don't forget to give your children the benefit of your godly perspective on life. Influence your children as you
