Raising Champions

Principal's Message: Teaching the Golden Rule to Our Children

One of the five standards of Living Grace Christian School is "Treat Others the Way You Want to Be Treated." This standard is taken from Luke 6:31 and is known as the Golden Rule: "Do to others as you would have them do to you" (NIV). The Golden Rule cannot be emphasized enough with our children. The philosophy that so often exists in the world is an evolutionary, survival-of-the-fittest mentality – basically, a "dog-eat-dog" perspective toward getting ahead in life. Instead of treating others the way that they treat us, God calls us to treat others the way we would want to be treated. Based on God's sowing and reaping principle of life, if our children consistently sow seeds of kindness and friendship toward others, eventually they will reap the harvest of kindness and friendship returning to them. Helping our children learn how to treat others is a very important point of emphasis in their character development.



How do we apply the Golden Rule in the training of our children? This principle for life should be continually emphasized in the home. As parents, Silvia and I like to come up with short Biblical sayings as we train and discipline our children. Sayings such as "Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace" (Eph. 4:3) help to focus our children's attention on a character issue. (I sometimes say "Let's keep an attitude of peace" to remind our children how they are to relate to their siblings.) Of course, another saying that I often find helpful to emphasize is "Let's treat each other the way we would want to be treated." Helping children consider how they would want to be treated will provide them with instruction on how they should treat siblings, friends, neighbors, fellow students, their elders, and indeed, everyone they encounter in life.

The Golden Rule has many applications. When we need to discipline our child because he has hurt another child, we can exhort him to walk according to the Golden Rule by asking questions such as, "Would you want someone to hit you?" After your child says, "No," you emphasize, "Then don't hit your brother."

Many applications could be made as you question your child according to the Golden Rule: "Would you want someone to call you names or put you down?" "Would you want someone to gossip about you and tell others bad things about you?" "Would you want someone to grab your toy from you?" "Would you want someone to spit at you?" "If you were a teacher, would you want one of your students to be disrespectful toward you?" "If you were preparing a meal for others, would you

want one of them to say they didn't like the food?" The Golden Rule should be a continual point of emphasis in the home, especially as we seek to help our children learn how to treat others.

A big area in how children treat one another is in the use of the tongue. The Bible says that the tongue "is a restless evil, full of deadly poison" (James 3:8). One of the Scriptures that I often repeat to the students is that of Ephesians 4:29: "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen." For us as parents, we can emphasize simple phrases such as "Wholesome talk" or "Use only kind words" or "Only encouraging words"; in the process, our children learn this life principle.

The Bible says that the tongue has the power of life and death. It's not possible to over emphasize how powerful one's words can be—for good or for bad! I want to encourage us to hold our children to a high standard in the use of our tongues as we seek to walk by the Golden Rule. Please emphasize this principle with your children.

Our commitment at Living Grace is that the school would be a place of safety, security, and encouragement. We want it to be a safe and secure environment so that students can focus on learning. That way they are free from negative distractions and are able to learn to the maximum of their potential! Likewise, we desire that the school be a place of encouragement where only edifying words come from the teachers and from fellow students so that the students may be built up to know their position in Christ and God's great plan for their lives! While we can't guarantee perfection, let's partner as teachers and parents to make sure that this message of treating others the way we want to be treated and of using our words for the sole purpose of building up others—never tearing them down—is written upon our children's hearts and minds!

Godly Character Trait for March: Caring—from God's Name of Jehovah Rohi, The Lord Our Shepherd

As we pray for our children and the school, I encourage you to refer to the "Prayer Needs" as given in this edition of *Raising Champions*. I also ask you to pray for the health of the entire school body as we continue through the winter. Lift up the students and the teachers as we finish the third quarter, including studying for end-of-quarter tests and preparation of report cards.

During the month of March, we are focusing on the character quality of caring. This trait is part of the nature of Jehovah Rohi. Psalm 23:1-3 shares beautifully about the caring nature of the Lord our Shepherd: "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want. He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he restores my soul." I pray that our Lord's character of bringing rest and restoration to others would manifest in our students' lives. May God's grace be with you and your families!
