# Raising Champions

## Principal's Message: Parents Partnering with Teachers

At Living Grace Christian School, our vision statement includes the clause that "parents partner with the school's staff. . ." This partnership between the parents and the teachers is critical in order for our school to work effectively. I continue to be impressed by the consistency of parents keeping their children on track with their studies. In addition, I am pleased with the number of parents helping out the teachers with tasks such as checking math books in the morning and volunteering in the classroom, both practical ways of partnering with the teachers to help our students receive an excellent education.



Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 says, "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their work: If one falls down, his friend can help him up. But pity the man who falls and has no one to help him up! Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm. But how can one keep warm alone? Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken" (NIV).

This passage speaks of the importance of teamwork, or of what we call partnership. Not much in the Kingdom of God is accomplished by the lone warrior. Although God can do much through a person who has wholly surrendered to the Lord, often that person works in tandem with other people. We work in partnership with others to accomplish God's purposes. As we work together, we are able to lift each other up. **In the school setting, we see the unbreakable, three-stranded cord in our children's lives as the parents, the church, and the school. As these three godly influences are in right order and relationship, our children will be raised up to be champions for Christ.**

As I alluded to earlier, at Living Grace Christian School we call you as parents to keep your children on track with their studies. There are certain tools that we use at school in order to enable this kind of practical partnership so that our students can keep progressing forward instead of falling behind. These tools enable you to help your children at home and to stay on top of their studies. You are able to talk with them about specific assignments, to encourage them, and to hold them accountable in a timely manner before it is too late. In other words, we give you as parents the tools you need to help your children succeed academically and grow in godly character. These tools relate to the value of having open communication between teachers and parents.

### The Assignment Book

I am a firm believer in "writing things down." The students at Living Grace Christian School are trained and held accountable in this principle through writing their assignments each morning into their assignment books. This enables teachers and parents to work together to ensure that their children have completed their work satisfactorily. When a student has to be absent, a

student can call another student and easily get the assignments because we know that the assignments have been written down accurately. I recall when my son Caleb was out sick for a couple of days; he called a parent of one of his classmates and asked her for the assignments from her daughter’s assignment book. He was able to get the assignments quickly and easily. Of course, we were grateful to this family for their help. In our school, students are able to get their assignments from

one another when they are out sick, and parents can be confident that they have the right assignments.

## Weekly Teacher Email

The weekly teacher email is another tool that speaks of open communication. Besides the fact that parents can come in and talk with the teacher before or after school and have a reasonable expectation that they will be able to share or get the information that they need, each teacher also sends an electronic mail to the parents each Monday to share about the week and to encourage parents to interact with their child on a specific learning assignment. Of course, parents may reply to the email and communicate with the teacher as necessary.

## Parent-Teacher Conferences

On November 21st, we will have our first parent-teacher conferences of the year. These team meetings are exactly that—team meetings: the opportunity to partner together as teachers and parents for our children’s continued encouragement and growth. I often say, “There are no magical solutions for children receiving a great education.” It’s only through parents and teachers working hard and working together through excellent communication that our children will be educated and raised up to be the champions God is calling them to be. These conferences are invaluable times of two-way communication so that our children can continue to progress in areas of academics, godly character, and Christian discipleship. As we can see, working at communication is critical to the partnership required to achieve the mission God has given us. **Parents, my heartfelt exhortation is to use the tools that we provide you to work with your children.** I encourage you to take full advantage of our commitment to partner with you in practical ways in order for our children to become the champions God is calling them to be!
